


Landfill 6 Closure Continues

Closure work continues around perimeter of active landfill.

This year MAX will continue closure work around the perimeter of Landfill 6. Approximately 2.5 acres of the base on the Spring Street and Millbell Road sides of the landfill will be closed by year's end, leaving a small portion open to the inside of the facility. Approximately four acres of the landfill were closed last year.

The landfill will remain active for waste disposal throughout this year and beyond, as closure work continues moving inward. The capping work is expected to continue for about three more years.



Landfill 6 will remain active as closure continues around the landfill base and moves inward.

ENVIRONMENTAL PERMIT UPDATES

Final Water Discharge Permit in Effect

MAX's renewed wastewater discharge permit (NPDES permit) became effective January 1, 2022. The permit requires monitoring of all water that flows from the site, including stormwater, and sets standards for treating

industrial and sanitary wastewater before discharge.

DEP renewed the permit following two public comment periods held last year. The current permit includes updated site information, as well as revised monitoring and

testing requirements for monthly reporting. Data from monthly reports by MAX and other NPDES permit holders are publicly available on the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) website.

Application for Hazardous Waste Landfill 7 Resubmitted

In February, MAX submitted a revised Phase 1 application for proposed Hazardous Waste Landfill 7 to the DEP. The submission addressed DEP's

May 2021 comments on application material originally submitted in March of 2021. Complete copies of the current application materials are

available for review at both the South Huntingdon Township municipal office and the DEP's Pittsburgh Office.

MAX Earth Day Tire and Electronics Recycling Event

Saturday, April 23, 9 a.m. - Noon

MAX notes that large tractor/farm tires can no longer be accepted.

Mark your calendars for MAX's annual Earth Day recycling event. Residents from Yukon and surrounding areas can drop off unwanted electronics and a limited number of tires on Saturday, April 23, 2022, from 9:00 a.m. to noon, at MAX's Yukon facility (233 MAX Lane, Yukon, PA, 15698).

Local residents (no commercial operators, please) can bring up to eight passenger car or light truck tires. MAX notes that large tractor/farm tires can no longer be accepted. "Unfortunately, there is

no longer a recycling outlet available to us for these items," said Environmental General Manager Carl Spadaro.

Tires collected from the event will be recycled through Penn Turf. Electronics collected at the event will be recycled through Westmoreland Cleanways and Recycling.

"We are happy to partner again with MAX Environmental in the coordination of the electronics collection," said Mike Skapura, Executive Director of Westmoreland Cleanways. "With the exception of

appliances, all electronics will be accepted—including TV's of any size, as long as they are not smashed or broken. If it has an electrical cord, we can take it!"
